Product Safety

No Cam and Groove coupling system should ever be used for air, nitrogen, or any other compressed gas service due to the decompression of the gases and the hose whip that will result in an accidental opening of the quick-acting arms. An on-going program of inspecting cam and groove handles, rings and pins must be in place to eliminate problems. Damaged, missing or broken parts of fittings must be replaced. These parts are durable but not indestructible. Every effort must be made to be certain that no one attempts to use the cam and groove couplings with damaged or missing cam arms.

The on-going inspection program should also include the gaskets of these couplings to be sure they are not worn or missing. The gasket and coupling material must be compatible with the media that flows through the assembly. A corrosion resistance reference guide is provided in the Dixon catalog and also on our website under the 'technical' tab.

Dates in History

1896 On June 4th, in the shed behind his home on Bagley Avenue in Detroit, Henry Ford unveiled the "Quadricycle," the first automobile he ever designed or drove.
