Product Safety

Safe Quick Coupling Practices

To avoid premature coupling failure, while ensuring operator safety, the following is recommended:

- 1. Always wipe the coupling cavities and faces clean before connecting a coupling.
- **2**. Connect the coupling before installation to ensure that it works properly.
- **3**. Always check the body seals before connecting a coupling.
- 4. Shut-off power source before connecting a coupling.
- 5. Always install a Safety-Check Valve on a pneumatic line and/or compressor.
- 6. Always use King Safety-Cables on large air lines (1/2" lines and larger).
- 7. Always use a Whip Hose to connect the air hose to the air tool.
- 8. Use dust caps and plugs when couplings are not in use.
- **9**. If the locking sleeve is inoperable, check the safety lock.
- **10**. Wear eye protection while connecting or disconnecting a coupling.
