The Florida East Coast Railway External served the island until 1935, when it was destroyed by a hurricane.
- **1948** On January 4, the British colony of Burma, now Myanmar, became an independent nation after more than sixty years of colonial rule. England had established control of the country in 1885, designating Burma a province of India.
